



Dr. Jyoti Atwal is Associate Professor of Modern History at the Centre for Historical Studies, School of Social Sciences, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, India & Visiting Associate Professor (2022-2027) at UCD School of History, University College Dublin, Ireland.

She specialises in Modern Indian history and the post-colonial period with a focus on gender, socio-cultural history and transnational anti-imperial movements.

Her latest publications include a co-edited volume on *Gender and History: Ireland 1852-1922*, (London: Routledge, 2022). In 2021 she co-edited a book with Eunan O'Halpin on *India, Ireland and Anti-Imperial Struggle: Remembering the Connaught Rangers Mutiny, 1920*, Delhi: Aakar Books, 2021 (supported by Embassy of Ireland, New Delhi). She co-edited a volume on *Gender and Violence in Historical and Contemporary Perspectives: Situating India* (London: Routledge, 2020). She has authored *Real and Imagined Widows: Gender Relations in Colonial North India* (New Delhi: Primus Books, 2016).

In 2017, she developed a MA and MPhil lecture Course on Women in Ireland: Reforms, Movements and Revolutions (1840-1930). She serves on the advisory board of several projects at University College Cork and University College Dublin. She is currently writing a biography of Margaret Cousins. She has delivered several lectures on Cousins and has been on a BBC radio programme.
